Scientists have invented drugs that they added into handkerchiefs, so the dogs can't smell temporary.

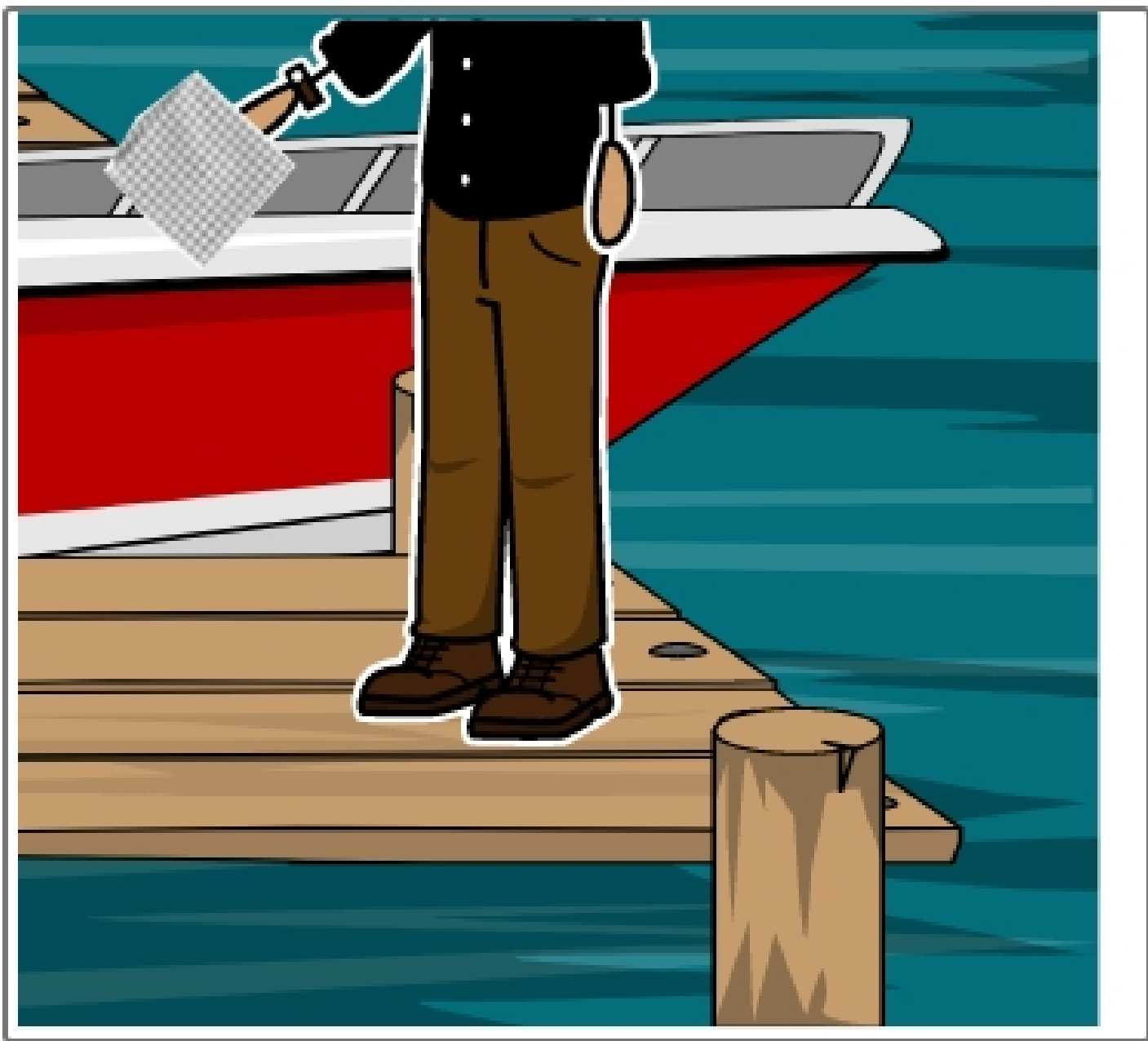


that handkerchief was the thing that could save people from not getting caught. Sailors would take the handkerchief out and it would temporarily disable the dogs smell.
